### **Speaker Bios**

### Orrin Hudson, Founder and Executive Director, Be Someone, Inc.

Orrin "Checkmate" Hudson is a former Alabama state trooper, Air Force veteran, and world-renowned chess champion. He is the author of the #1 Amazon best seller, *One Move at a Time, How to Win at Chess and Life*. He is a speaker/facilitator and the founder of Be Someone, a Georgia-based nonprofit which provides a youth-focused leadership skills development program on how to win in life using the game of chess. His formula – using the chess board – teaches that for every move that is made, whether it is playing the game or living as a contributing citizen, there is a corresponding positive or negative consequence.

Hudson has traveled across America successfully providing his unique, exciting and engaging curriculum to over 55,000 young people. Hudson's ultimate vision is to serve one million at risk students using his motivating mantra: "Get Your Heads-Up!!, Pants-Up! and Grades-Up!, and most of all, to "Never Give Up! – No Matter What!"

#### Erika Shields, Chief of Police, City of Atlanta Police Department

Erika Shields is the 24th Chief of the City of Atlanta Police Department, appointed in December 2016. She is an advocate for 21st Century Policing – with a focus on reducing crime while also strengthening trust and collaboration with our communities. Chief Shields has a tough mindset on crime, but a compassionate and proactive approach to working with the community and its leaders while also ensuring accountability for officers.

She is committed to developing a culture of technology, innovation, excellence and transparency throughout the organization. Chief Shields joined the Atlanta Police Department in 1995 following a career as a stockbroker. During her tenure, she has risen through the ranks as a Patrol Officer, Sergeant, Lieutenant, Major and Deputy Chief prior to her appointment as Chief. Chief Shields holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in International Studies from Webster University and a Master's degree in Criminal Justice from Saint Leo University.

She is an active member of the Georgia Association of Chiefs of Police (GACP), the National Organization of Black Law Enforcement Executives (NOBLE), the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP), and the Police Executive Research Forum (PERF). She was appointed as a board member to the Criminal Justice Coordinating Council by Gov. Nathan Deal in August 2017.

#### Dave Wilkinson, President and CEO, Atlanta Police Foundation

Dave Wilkinson joined the Foundation in 2005. Before joining the Foundation, Dave retired as the Special Agent in Charge of the U.S. Secret Service, Georgia Region. During his 22-year tenure with the Secret Service, Dave served as the Special Agent in Charge of the Office of Investigations, as well as the Assistant Special Agent in Charge of the Presidential Protection Division, serving under Presidents Clinton and George W. Bush. Dave was awarded the Distinguished Service award from President Bush for supervision of agents/decisive actions on September 11, 2001.

Dave Wilkinson leads the Atlanta Police Foundation in its mission to make Atlanta the safest large city in the nation and provide viable solutions that address public safety concerns. Currently, the Atlanta Police Foundation is preparing to implement several key programs focused on increased police visibility, youth crime prevention and a continued expansion of the Operation Shield program — an advanced technology approach that responds to public safety matters through surveillance monitoring, active shooter response capabilities and much more.

In 2015 after being asked by Mayor Kasim Reed to convene a commission to address the issue of Repeat Offenders in the City of Atlanta, the Atlanta Police Foundation published a detail report of various findings; and an appointed team of stakeholders presented recommendations and action plans to make serious and necessary improvements in the criminal justice system.
